



Intermediate Orton-Gillingham Approach Training

Course Overview: In this course students will enhance their understanding of the higher level concepts included in the Basic Language ~ Orton-Gillingham Approach. The ten essential elements of a multisensory teaching approach will be reviewed as well as the importance of utilizing the visual, auditory and kinesthetic pathways simultaneously when working with students with language-based learning differences. More advanced spelling rules taught in Basic Orton-Gillingham will be addressed in depth as well as the schwa vowel sound and unaccented vs. accented syllables. Students will explore the required multisensory steps to introduce affixes and roots to upper level Orton-Gillingham students.
